



The Silver Grill, 1930 - ca. 1940

The Silver Grill offered full course meals for \$1. Room service was available for an additional 25¢ per person.

During the 1930's, the Silver Grill introduced an outdoor terrace on what is now the roof of the garage. It is unclear when the Roof Garden opened but by 1936 an advertisement invited guests to "Dine on the Terrace...Overlooking Rock Creek Park."

The Roof Garden likely closed just before or during World War II.

Renovations

In the late 1930's, the Broadmoor's dining room and lobby underwent extensive remodeling changing styles from Tudor to Art Deco.

The dining room was partitioned into three separate rooms and the Art Deco Bar was created. The Art Deco bar was a favorite hangout of the Washington Senators baseball team during the 1930s and 1940s. A number of the team members lived here at that time.
