

The Marguery Restaurant, 1938-1948

For a time between 1938 and 1948, the restaurant was named Marguery Restaurant for “Finer Foods and Cocktails” with “Nino and Pierre At Your Command.”

The Broadmoor Restaurant, Post-1948

In the years immediately following the Broadmoor’s conversion to a cooperative in 1948, several proprietors oversaw the restaurant. In 1949, Mrs. Zada Daniels and Miss Helen Dickson, both building residents, operated the Broadmoor Restaurant.

In April 1955, the renowned chef George Zinkler took over the restaurant:

“The long awaited moment has come, George Zinkler, noted Congressional Club manager, is in town with a restaurant at the Broadmoor. For those who never tried Mr. Zinkler’s famous recipes, there’s a treat in store.... The Broadmoor is charmingly different. Sparkling white tablecloths and a lovely décor make the Broadmoor a pleasant dining rendezvous. And the free parking in the Broadmoor garage is a happy privilege.”

Braun’s, 1957-1969

In 1957, Mr. and Mrs. Erich Braun took over operation of the restaurant, gave it their name, and gained fame for Mrs. Braun’s ice sculptures.
